

Military Camps During the Spanish War of 1898 The assembling of 250,000 volunteer troops in military camps within a short time after the declaration of war against Spain in the spring of 1898 taxed all the bureaus of the War Department to the utmost. The Medical Corps of the Regular Army was barely sufficient for our little Army of 25,000 men. To this corps of trained medical officers were suddenly added 115 commissioned medical officers of volunteers and 382 medical officers of State organisations, most of whom had had no previous military experience. Owing to the extensive provalence of typhoid fever in our camps, it became necessary at a later date to reenforce this enlarged corps of medical officers by the employment of contract surgeons. The number of contract surgeons in service on June 30, 1898, was 161; July 81, 272; August 31, 512; September 30, 504.
